 The Virginia Livable Home Credit (LHT) program is designed to improve accessibility and universal visitability in Virginia's residential units by providing state tax credits for purchase of new units or the retoroitting of existing housing units. Tax credits are available for up to \$6,500 for the purchase/construction of a new accessible residence and up to 50 percent for the cost of retrofitting units, not to exceed \$6,500.
